The RCS girls track team had one of their best seasons in recent history qualifying three relays to the IHSA State Meet.

Outside of those three relays, the 2018 was the largest in program history, adding much needed depth to all event areas. One of several highlighted growth areas was the pole vault. Miriam Safford, 6th place pole vaulter from sectionals, has helped grow that event area over the last three years with Coach Christine Regan. The 800m run, a highly competitive event area within our program had ten different girls competing for the coveted varsity spots on that state-qualifying relay. Young talent in the sprints also helped deepen and strengthen our open and relay sprints. Overall, the season was full of a large number of Top 10 performances, and shows signs of continuing to grow in the years to come.
